- All trainings are related to one of the Alabama Department of Human Resources (DHR) Training Categories, Child Development Associate (CDA) Subject Areas, Alabama Pathways Core Knowledge Areas (CKA), and Child Care Development Fund (CCDF).

Training Policies

- 1. Childcare Resources training is open to all persons regardless of race, national origin, religion, age, sex, political beliefs, disabilities or socioeconomic status. Childcare Resources demonstrates its commitment to treat everyone with fairness and respect by valuing diversity, inclusion and its culture through the development and delivery of its learning events. Childcare Resources is committed to providing reasonable accommodation for individuals with disabilities in its services, programs, and activities. - 2. Submission of a registration form grants permission for Childcare Resources to take photographs during training to use in agency publications and on social media.
- 3. Training begins on time; you are expected to arrive on time. Once training begins, entering the training will be prohibited.
- 4. Childcare Resources is accredited by the International Association for Continuing Education and Training (IACET). Childcare Resources complies with the ANSI/IACET Standard, which is recognized internationally as a standard of excellence in instructional practices. As a result of this accreditation, Childcare Resources is authorized to issue the IACET CEU. To receive full clock hours and CEU credit, you must be present for the entire training.
- 5. Learners are expected to actively participate in all training activites; complete a pre- and post-assessment, which will be used for the evaluation of the learning outcomes and learning expectations, and submit a training evaluation.
- 6. Children are not permitted at any training session.
- 7. Cancellations and registration for substitutions are permitted one full business day prior to scheduled training. Refunds are not available.
- 8. <u>Substitution Policy:</u> Substitutions are only allowed for paid trainings and must be completed one full business day in advance of a training. If you would like to send a substitute in the place of a registered learner, you must complete a registration form for the new learner and call Beth Nelson at (205) 945-0018 Ext. 302. Substitutions on the day of the training will not be permitted. The original registered learner will be withdrawn from registration and must re-register with a new form.
- 9. <u>Training Attendance Policy:</u> Due to high demand of our trainings and limited seating, Childcare Resources will allow learners to have three no-shows in a 12-month period for pre-registered trainings. After three no-shows, you will be notified that you are not allowed to pre-register for trainings. You will be allowed to arrive at the time of the training and register for any available seating. Seating will not be guaranteed and is based on availability.
- 10. <u>Inclement Weather:</u> In the event of a weather-related delay or closure at Childcare Resources, updates will be posted on the agency's website, www.ccr-bhm.org. Any affected session(s) will be rescheduled with the new date communicated via the website.

IN-PERSON

In-person trainings held at Childcare Resources or another specified location at a specific date and time.

LIVE VIRTUAL TRAINING

Virtual training with a live instructor at a specific date and time through Childcare Resources' Online Portal.

TRAINING ON DEMAND



In 2004, the Alabama Legislature passed a new law addressing the safe medication of children in child care facilities known as the Baby Douglas Law. The law focuses on giving children only medications that are prescribed by a doctor or that are appropriate for the age of the child, and requires caregivers to follow dosage instructions precisely.
